What a Coup(é)!

Once upon a time it was impossible to find a reasonably specified sports vehicle in anything other than a gas guzzling V6 or V8. These days most flagship vehicles - even from prestige marques - have a powerful diesel engine at the heart of them. In fact, diesel engines are out-performing their petrol counterparts in all aspects of performance, from power to durability.

This brings us to look at some of the most recent additions to the world of prestige coupés and cabriolets. The Tunit staff normally have the privilege of extended test drives in these new vehicles whilst carrying out initial testing, so we have asked some of the guys for their verdict.

Audi A5

Before and After Tunit

Standard Power: 240 bhp
Tuned Power: 270 bhp
Standard Torque: 368 lbs/ft
Tuned Torque: 405 lbs/ft

Launched mid 2007, the Audi A5 utilises the proven Quattro system for handling and offers a choice of 2.7 or 3.0 V6 diesels at 190 and 240 ps respectively. The interesting figure is the 368 lbs/ft of torque on the 3.0, which beats the 349 bhp petrol V8's figure of 324 lbs/ft by 44 lbs/ft.

Weighing in at a £33,400 starting price, this is one of the heavy contenders in the coupé market, although the diesel option costs less than the S5 petrol V8. The extras soon add up and you won't want this car without the majority of them, so expect to pay £38k - £40k on the road.

Michael says:

What a tremendous car to drive even in standard. It holds the road as you would expect from the Quattro system - nothing less than driving on rails. The interior was one of the best I've ever seen on an Audi, with everything within reach of both hands. Despite the takeoff and mid range being very impressive, I knew this giant, heavy coupé could benefit from the Tunit. After fitting on this first one, a dramatic improvement was felt low down, and the extra 51 lbs/ft of torque was there instantaneously.

Alfa Brera

Before and After Tunit

Standard Power: 200 bhp
Tuned Power: 230 bhp
Standard Torque: 270 lbs/ft
Tuned Torque: 315 lbs/ft

The Brera has been praised worldwide by the press for its beautiful design outside and in, combined with Alfa's incredibly well developed common rail diesel engine. We were lucky enough to test one of the first ones in early 2007 for 'What Diesel Car' magazine. The article was very complimentary about the car to say the least, and of the post-Tunit performance. You can find the full article on www.tunit.com.

Priced from a very reasonable £23,000 up to a maximum of £30,000, you can get a very well kitted out luxurious and sporty car for £26,000 with a 2.4 JTDM engine.

Dan says:

This is one of the few Alfas that I have had the pleasure of driving. Quite frankly I stayed away from them as one of our sales staff at the time was annoyingly besotted by them; we were all convinced he went home and made dinner for his battered old Alfa before drawing the curtains! Having already experienced the GT I was still not yet an Alfa lover, however if anything was going to take the girlfriend's place then the Brera was one of the top contenders. The performance of the 2.4 JTDM was disappointing, but it felt better than the GT. With the Tunit fitted and given a little extra adjustment the car was transformed. No lag whilst setting off! The engine was smoother than before, the torque feeling a lot lower down and the power band extended. The dyno confirmed what I felt, giving figures of 240 bhp and 351 lbs/ft of torque - a gain of 40 bhp and 81 lbs/ft of torque! The car's owner later confirmed a significant fuel saving. It's now one of my favourite cars tuned, but the girlfriend is now the wife, so sorry Brera!

Volvo C70

Before and After Tunit

Standard Power: 185 bhp
Tuned Power: 210 bhp
Standard Torque: 295 lbs/ft
Tuned Torque: 335 lbs/ft

The C70 is the oldest of the coupés we are looking at, but surprisingly not old-looking or even boxy as you would expect from Volvo. The folding roof is one of the car's best features and is a masterpiece to watch in action. Newly updated, the D5 engine now boasts 185 bhp with a DPF and is receiving glowing reports.

Prices start from £29,000, although leaving a sports convertible in standard would be sacrilege, and by the time a reasonable amount of extras are put on, you will be looking at £34,000.00 upwards on the road.

Michael says:

I first drove and owned a C70 almost 9 years ago. It was and still is one of the most enjoyable cars I have ever had: luxury and performance in one package. When I drove this even sportier model I was disappointed to find out there was no manual version. However, this is a personal preference and I know others who would think the opposite. The handling was as smooth as I remember, although not as sporty as some. It gave a good feel of luxury and comfort that surpasses the rest of the Volvo range. Once tuned it was like having a new engine transplant. The D5 engine then felt like a D10! There was now an extra 50 lbs/ft of torque available from take-off, and the C70 was a much smoother drive through the gears.

Mercedes CLS 320

Before and After Tunit

Standard Power: 224 bhp
Tuned Power: 265 bhp
Standard Torque: 375 lbs/ft
Tuned Torque: 425 lbs/ft

If these vehicles were the four horsemen of the apocalypse, then the CLS would be War, with its aggressive and powerful looks making it very intimidating. These looks, along with its luxury and performance come with the highest price tag of the group, but the car has arguably the best and most powerful drive. Mercedes have always been noted for their excellent diesel technology and this car is no exception.

The CLS is priced from £44,000 to a jaw dropping £74,000 for a top of the range AMG god of war. Fortunately you will find a very well specified diesel-engined CLS for just over £44,000, giving a good level of standard equipment and the knowledge of only 60 lbs/ft less of torque than the £30,000 extra AMG version.

Craig says:

Compared to Mercedes Benz I have previously driven, this felt every bit as much like riding on air. The fact these cars come with air suspension may have been a contributing factor. The acceleration was incredible and its 0-60 time of 7.0 seconds was very believable. Once tuned it was superb; touching the accelerator threw you back in your seat and it took corners like a dream. What was most entertaining about this was the reaction of this customer during his tuned test drive. Most customers give a surprised 'wow' or the corners of their mouths turn up as they try out the new power: this customer just giggled all the way there and back.

Bruntingthorpe Day Out

In the early hours of a breezy September morning four cars were heading for the proving ground of Bruntingthorpe in Leicestershire. Home of the honourably retired and recently restored Vulcan Bomber, Bruntingthorpe was once a bustling airfield used by the US and British air force during the cold war. Nowadays it is used as a proving test track by manufacturers, the government and the occasional privateer.

So arrived the Tunit posse, along with the winner and two runners-up from a competition run by Tunit in 'What Diesel Car' magazine, whose editor Garth Sumpter came along for the ride. Each driver was to try out his own vehicle around the track, and also put in a lap using Tunit's own Seat Leon. The Leon was used in the majority of 2007 exhibitions and promotions, being the first VAG 170 bhp 2.0 TDI to be tuned. Before going onto the track the Leon was improved yet on its original tune of 170-195 bhp and 258-291 lbs/ft, to an outstanding 207 bhp and 311 lbs/ft of torque.

At 10.30 am it was decided a few practice laps would be appropriate. First up was Allan Boyd in his 2.5 VW Touareg producing 174 bhp & 296 lbs/ft in standard. After a startlingly quick initial lap it was revealed that everyone

Tunit installation on all three vehicles, the drivers were ready to go again. This run would see how the cars performed with the Tunit unchanged from its factory settings.

The results came flying in, with Alan in his Vectra now improving to an incredible 01:51.73, making the most use of his now improved take off ability. Chris in his Skoda also trimmed off an amazing 6 seconds with ease and Allan in his Touareg went to the top of his class with his heavy motor at 1:49.80.

After a another quick add up and break, each vehicle was then given an extra laptop tune by our Tunit expert Dan Johnston. Parameters were altered to gain maximum torque low down whilst improving the band of useable torque throughout. Important here and also on the road was an extension of torque and bhp above the normal 4000 rpm. Extra power was given to all vehicles to allow a longer time to be spent in the gears without changing.

These final laps showed another amazing improvement, hopefully due to the clever tuning to suit the drivers needs. First in was Allan in the Touareg with an even better 01:46.51, pretty amazing for such a weighty vehicle.



else had a large handicap. Alan let slip that he was an ex saloon car racing driver, so it seemed a foregone conclusion who would win the head to head times. However, the main idea was to see how well the cars could perform around the two mile track, before fitting the Tunit and seeing how many seconds the drivers could shave off their times.

After prize winner Alan Dawson (Vauxhall Vectra CDTi), and the other runner-up Chris Brooke (Skoda Fabia VRS) had put in their warm-up laps, it was time to put the cars and the drivers' skills to the test.

First out again was Allan in his Touareg. He soon ate up the track, taking the bends like a man possessed and finishing with a very respectable time of 01:53.17. Next off the starting blocks was Chris Brooke in his Skoda. We expected quicker times from this lighter and more performance orientated animal, and we were not disappointed with Chris returning a very comfortable and confidence boosting 01:56.82. Last but not least was our star prize winner of the day Alan Dawson in his Vauxhall Vectra. The Vectra had a slow start, but gained back ground on the two long straights, coming in with a still strong 02:02.80.

A great start for all and a benchmark which began bringing out the competitiveness of the whole group. After a short break and a very quick

Second was the Vectra shaving nearly another 2 seconds off his time with 01:50.02. Unfortunately Chris in his Skoda lost a little time at 01:51.23; we can only assume he was having an 'off' lap!

To round off the day each driver queued up for a drive in the Tunit enhanced Leon. The black Leon was boasting a recent drag-strip 0-60 time of 6.7 seconds, so this was going to be interesting!

Garth Sumpter decided to try out his racing skills instead of writing skills and after a couple of laps a very happy editor clocked up a time of 01:43.78.

Prize winner Alan Dawson followed, gliding back into the pits after a time of 01:42.69. Next off was Allan Boyd, who flew round with a easy 01:37.02, to no-one's surprise. The car came in like a well ridden race horse showing off hot tyres and glowing brakes. Last but not least was Chris Brooke with a time of 01:43.62.

So who won? Well the idea was to show some customers as well as a magazine the before and after effects of Tunit and how the tuning effects overall performance and driving style. So the outcome was that everyone had an enjoyable day and saw and felt the difference. There were no prizes for 1st or runner up, just a fun day out for all.

Whats Hot ?

Last year we looked at the most popular marques to tune and came up with some surprises. This issue the top five is just as intriguing with the VAG dropping down the list a little and Toyota and Landrover creeping in there. The list is compiled from world wide sales of Tunit in 10 countries over a period of 168 days.

1. BMW

At pole position is BMW, the 3 Series being the most popular and making up the majority of cars tuned.

2. VAG

Coming in a close second is VAG, mostly made up unsurprisingly by the Golf and also its light commercial range. Seat also make up a good number of the sales.

3. Toyota

With a large number of 4WD and SUVs mostly sold overseas, Toyota lives up to its reputation as making some of the most popular 4WD vehicles.

4. Land Rover

The new V6 & V8 engines have accounted for most of the tuned vehicles in the group. A great testimony as to how great these two engines are.

5. Vauxhall
